ON JUNE 27, 2019, family and members of the Department gathered at One Police Plaza to honor the memory of Detective Harold Jacob, 58, who was killed in the line of duty 52 years ago at a Plaque

Dedication Ceremony. On January 18, 1967, Detective Jacob and several other officers responded to shots fired at a local building. Upon the officers' arrival to the location, they were fired upon. They were able to return fire and wound the gunman, who just prior to their arrival, was involved in an armed payroll robbery where he shot his victim. During the investigation, Detective Jacob discovered the wounded victim, and while rendering aid, suffered a fatal heart attack. During his 34-year career, Detective Harold Jacob was recognized seven times for Excellent Police Duty, five times for Meritorious Police Duty, once for



The extended family of Detective Jacob including his sons, Bobby and Jimmy; his daughter, Dorothy; and his grandchildren, Richard, and Allison, a retired NYPD sergeant, 41 Precinct. Detective Jacob's eldest son, Henry "Buddy" Jacob, was also a detective assigned to the Safe, Truck, and Loft Squad. He passed away in 1987.

Exceptional Merit, and was the recipient of three Commendations. In June 1968,

he was posthumously awarded the Medal of Honor. ■

ON JUNE 13, 2019, a softball tournament named in memory of Detective Joseph Lemm, Bronx Warrant Squad, was held at Juniper Park in Queens. The outing also honored Sergeant Paul Tuozzolo.

On December 21, 2015, Detective Joseph Lemm, who also served as a United States Air Force Technical Sergeant, with the Air National Guard, was killed in Afghanistan, when his convoy was attacked

by a suicide bomber. He served three tours of duty in the Air Force, one in Iraq, and two in Afghanistan. During his 15-year NYPD career, he made 427 arrests, and was the recipient of five Departmental Commendations.

Sergeant Paul Tuozzolo, 43 Precinct, was shot and killed on November 4, 2016, during the investigation of a call of domestic violence. Sergeant Tuozzolo and other

officers located the suspect who fled the scene after holding his family hostage. As Sergeant Tuozzolo and another sergeant exited their patrol car, the subject opened fire striking both officers. Sergeant Tuozzolo was critically wounded; a second sergeant was struck in the leg. Other officers at the scene returned fire, killing the suspect. Sergeant Tuozzolo, a 19-year veteran, died a short time later at the hospital. ■
