



The NYPD Medical Division is pleased to announce that we will begin vaccinating retired Uniform and Civilian Members of the Service that fit the following criteria:

- The member is required to be a **resident of New York State** age 65 and older, **OR**....
- **Individuals with one of the below comorbidities or underlying conditions.** The list is subject to change as additional scientific evidence is published and as New York State obtains and analyzes additional state-specific data. Retired MOS with the following conditions due to increased risk of moderate or severe illness or death from the virus that causes COVID-19 are eligible:
 - Cancer (current or in remission, including 9/11-related cancers);
 - Chronic kidney disease;
 - Pulmonary Disease, including but not limited to, COPD (chronic obstructive pulmonary disease), asthma (moderate-to-severe), pulmonary fibrosis, cystic fibrosis, and 9/11 related pulmonary diseases;
 - Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities including Down Syndrome;
 - Heart conditions, including but not limited to heart failure, coronary artery disease, cardiomyopathies, or hypertension (high blood pressure);
 - Immunocompromised state (weakened immune system) including but not limited to solid organ transplant or from blood or bone marrow transplant, immune deficiencies, HIV, use of corticosteroids, use of other immune weakening medicines, or other causes;
 - Severe Obesity (BMI 40 kg/m²), Obesity (body mass index [BMI] of 30 kg/m² or higher but < 40 kg/m²);
 - Pregnancy;
 - Sickle cell disease or Thalassemia;
 - Type 1 or 2 diabetes mellitus;
 - Cerebrovascular disease (affects blood vessels and blood supply to the brain);
 - Neurologic conditions, including but not limited to Alzheimer's Disease or dementia;
 - Liver disease.

All MOS must have their Department-issued Identification Card and fill out the NYS Immunization Screening and Consent Form. MOS receiving the vaccine based on age must bring a valid Driver's License or government issued ID indicating their date of birth.

For MOS with the above comorbidities or underlying conditions, they must fill out the "New York City Certification of Eligibility for COVID-19 Vaccine Due to Medical Condition" form. <https://www1.nyc.gov/assets/doh/downloads/pdf/covid/covid-19-vaccine-attestation.pdf>



Eligibility for the vaccine is determined by the New York State Department of Health and the NYPD Medical Division is required to comply. The NYPD will notify those outside of the above criteria when New York State expands the eligibility.

The NYPD Medical Division is administering the Moderna COVID-19 Vaccine. This is a two-dose vaccine separated by a minimum of 28 days. It has been determined through vigorous testing to be 94% effective after both doses. **The NYPD Medical Division has vaccinated over 16,000 Members of the Service**, administering over 30,000 first and second doses without any serious side effects.

Thursday, March 4, 2021 during the hours of 0600x1800 at:

Police Academy (Room PT 109), Lefrak (59-17 Junction Boulevard Queens 16th floor), Rodman's Neck (Intac Building), 121 Precinct (970 Richmond Avenue Staten Island)

Friday, March 5, 2021 during the hours of 0600x1800 at:

Police Academy (Room PT 109), Lefrak (59-17 Junction Boulevard Queens 16th floor), Rodman's Neck (Intac Building), 1 Police Plaza (Auditorium)

For the Police Academy Site, use the West Entrance at 30-29 College Point Boulevard.

No appointment is necessary at any of the locations.

At this time, we are not able to extend vaccinations to family members of active and retired members of the Department.

It is requested that all MOS wear their Department-issued Identification Card on their outermost garment when within Department facilities.
