On March 14, 2003, the lifeless, savagely beaten body of a young woman was found in a field off Bowser Road in the Town of Wallkill in Orange County, New York. The victim was **MEGAN MCDONALD**, the 20-year-old daughter of Det. Second Grade Dennis McDonald, who served the New York City Police Department for 20 years, retired from the NYPD in 2000, and passed away in 2002. Still reeling from the loss of their father, Megan's siblings and her mother were heart-broken by her senseless death.

Megan's homicide was caused by repeated blunt force trauma. It was determined that she had been murdered while in her car, a 1991 white Mercury Sable, which was located two days later in the parking lot of the Kensington Manor apartment complex in Middletown, New York. After Megan was killed, her body was deposited on the deserted, dirt path where it was later discovered.

Megan had been a graduate



of the prestigious John S. Burke Catholic High School. At the time of her death, she was enrolled at the Orange County Community College, part of the State University of New York's SUNY system. To help put herself through college, Megan worked as a waitress at the American Café in the Galleria Mall shopping center in Wallkill.

The brutal homicide of this beloved, lovely, young woman has not yet been resolved. Megan's family, friends, co-workers, and fellow students have never stopped believing that more witnesses can come forward to help resolve this heinous crime. Megan's family has never lost hope that eventually her killer will be identified and brought to justice. The New York State Troopers who have handled this investigation will never rest until this case is solved. *Megan McDonald deserves nothing less.*
