

Detective Investigator: Investigations – New York City

The Office of the Attorney General is seeking qualified candidates for Detective Investigator positions in the location noted above. Candidates should be hard-working, motivated and committed to public service on behalf of the people of the State of New York.

Detective Investigators, under supervision, conduct detailed investigations of the circumstances, facts and conditions connected with complaints and violations of the law, using the highest level of independent judgment and discretion. These are often highly complex and sensitive criminal matters which cross county lines and involve organized crime.

This position is assigned to the Executive Protection Unit. **The qualifications for this position are: Trained and certified in Dignitary/Executive Protection; experience conducting protection operations ensuring the security of high-level officials; experience in threat assessment, protective intelligence and logistical security planning and travel; experience conducting surveillance; must have experience facilitating interactions with several law enforcement agencies on the federal, state and local levels; experience leading team operations; experience interviewing witnesses, evaluating crimes scenes, and collecting and controlling evidence; having established contacts within the law enforcement community serving the greater New York City metropolitan area.**

Qualifications in addition to those listed above:

It is a requirement of this position that candidates possess and maintain a state of situational awareness and physical readiness in order to appropriately respond to any executive protection needs.

Must have at least 10 years of enforcement experience and current NYS basic police school certification with a demonstrated record of success in Dignitary or Executive Protection.

Alternatively, candidates will have a minimum of 2 years of law enforcement experience and current NYS basic police school certification **and** a minimum of 4 years of other relevant experience in the area(s) of Dignitary or Executive Protection or Security (i.e., qualified candidates will have military or private sector experience with “in-close” protection, or private sector experience in the areas of site security, threat/risk assessments, experience coordinating operations between government agencies or non-governmental organizations or private sector entities).

Must have the ability to drive a vehicle and possess a valid NYS driver’s license.

The Public Officer’s Law requires that police officers at the OAG be citizens of the United States and reside in New York State.

Performance of the duties may require frequent, unscheduled work on evenings and weekends and requires 24/7 availability. This position is in the exempt class, and incumbents serve at the pleasure of the Attorney General. The Hire Rate for this position is \$71,022. Appointments in New York City receive an additional \$3,026 location pay.
